Designate a specific area where you are going to start gathering your supplies. Choose a basket that you love, a fun tote, or other container that will make you happy to start filling. Go through the products that you have "stockpiled," and start finding the things that you might like to use for this workshop. Put them in your "Giving Well Stash." Once the workshop starts, you may want to adjust the items in your stash according to the gift ideas or you may not decide to create every gift I show you. That's ok! Just adapt, adjust and move forward, looking for the perfect gift for each person on your list and using "Giving Well" as a resource for all your gift-giving.

## GENERAL SUPPLIES

**Note:** These supplies can be used on many different projects throughout the workshop - and you may already have many of these things on hand.

- photos of those you are giving gifts to as well as photos of people, places and things that are important to them (you can start gathering or taking them now so you have some good choices).
- an 8 1/2" x 11" three-ring binder or file folder to use as your "Gift Resource File" (or you can create a storage file on your computer).
- coordinating pattern papers, single-sided and double-sided patterned cardstocks (most gift ideas only use a few sheets each).
- solid cardstock.
- ribbon (various widths and patterns).
- 8 1/2" x 11" white cardstock for printing.
- ink pads.
- alphabet stamps - various sizes or types will work.
- decorative stamps (various). I will be using stamps from my "[Post Script](http://Post Script)" line including "[Calendar](http://Calendar)".
- brads - small or various sizes.
- eyelets and eyelet setting tools.
- buttons - various sizes and colors.
- acrylic paint - white plus whatever colors you want.
- sticker letters or rub-on letters.
- chipboard letters.
- chipboard sheet (consider using the back of a notebook or pad of paper).
- notebook paper or lined notepad.
- hemp or string.
- flower embellishments of your choice such as silk, paper, chipboard, plastic, etc.
- various embellishments of your choice, such as photo corners, vinyl letters, printed transparencies, punctuation symbols, etc.

## TOOLS

- [Basic tool kit](#) (to purchase items like these [click here](#)).
- paper trimmer.
- scissors.
- paper piercer or thumb tack.
- corner rounder punch.
- circle cutter or circle punches.
- decorative scissors (large and small scallop, postage stamp).
- hole punches (1/8" and 1/4" size).
- thin journaling pen.
- ruler.
- pencil.
- foam paint brushes.
- sand paper or sanding block.
- craft knife and mat (I used BoBunny's fabulous system of a [Retractable Craft Knife](#) and [6"x12" Self-healing Cutting Mat](#)).
- computer and printer.
- favorite dry adhesive, such as a tape runner.
- foam squares or pop dots.
- glue dots.
- [Mod Podge](#) or other paint-on adhesive.
- Cheetah adhesive by Xyron (optional).

## SPECIFIC SUPPLIES

**Note:** These are used on one or two different projects - you may want to wait to see how the products are used before you purchase them.

- [Pig Tail Springs](#) by Piggy Tales (you will love these!).
- Sliding Door Tags by Piggy Tales.
- ["Happy" Chipboard Word Book](#) by BoBunny Press (worth getting the real deal!).
- two picture frames such as 5" x 7", 8" x 10", or 11" x 14". (The sizes don't have to be the same - these are used for different projects.)
- 1" binder rings that can be opened and closed.
- foam-core board (available at office supply stores).
- felt sheet (can be found at craft stores or in craft sections of department stores).
- felt letters (optional).
- [clear acrylic album pages by Scrapworks](#) - 8" x 8" tabbed version (you can make multiple gifts with just one album so your purchase will go far).
- [Chip Wheel](#) by Paper Trunk. (You'll for sure want this - probably more than one because they are so affordable. Any size will work.)

- fabric and coordinating acrylic paint (no sewing involved for this, though).
- small easel - can be something you decorate yourself or not (often available at craft stores or department stores in the home décor section).
- small jars with wide mouths, such as baby food jars, etc. You'll want them various heights and widths.
- **8" x 8" Slide Book** by Piggy Tales (these are so clever!).
- bulletin board (any size, but approximately 2' x 3' works well).
- decorative thumb tacks.
- **six 8" x 12" divided sheet protectors** (version B) by Scrapworks.
- 10"-12" long small dowel.
- lazy susan, kitchen storage "turntable", or food carousel - preferably with a lip around the edge (available at home stores or Amazon.com).
- stapler.
- paint dot applicator, such as a stylus or the rounded head of a pin.
- scoring blade or bone folder (optional).
- needle and embroidery floss or sewing machine (optional).
