Many of these supplies will already be listed on your general supply list but some of them won't. As you know, I support you doing your own thing as well! Don't be afraid to try new techniques and products but also try to use up your own stash when you can. Part of the fun is seeing your own take on each project or layout.

### Supplies Needed for December:

#### STACY'S BASICS

- paper trimmer
- precision-tipped scissors
- paper-to-paper adhesive (glue stick)
- photo adhesive (tape runner)
- black journaling pens (in sizes .03 and .08)
- pencil
- art gum eraser
- see-through ruler
- paper piercer
- craft knife

### Week 1 Project:

- 15-20 sheets of **cardstock** - each cut 6" x 8" (I used Bazzill Chile for my album).
- 5-7 clear transparency sheets that can be printed on.
- 5-7 sheets **white cardstock** (or other color for journaling printing).
- 4 yards 1/4" **ribbon** (I used the same kind for whole project but you can also use a variety).
- **journaling pen**.
- craft knife, cutting mat and metal ruler.
- **corner rounding punch**.
- sewing machine (totally optional).
- 3"-5" size **embellishments** of your choice (I used a few ghost snowflakes by Heidi Swapp).
- 15-20 photos (we'll talk about these in December).
- templates downloaded from classroom.
- **Zutter binding system** or 1" rings and a hole punch (or you can bind it at a copy shop).



### Week 3 "Life Tunes" Layout

**Note:** Check the classroom for Pre-Workshop instructions for preparing the cover and title page of your 9"x9" BoBunny Chipboard Bare Naked Binder. We created new layouts January through November with a final new layout in December. If you are just joining us, start where you are - each monthly layout can stand alone and doesn't need to be created using the BoBunny chipboard products if you choose.

- **9"x9" BoBunny My Word Arrow Page:** if you have taken any of the previous months of "A Life Well Crafted," you should already have these. We will use the back of November's tabbed page to finish off our album. If you are just joining us then you can make the layout using any size you choose as a stand-alone layout - not mounted on the chipboard.

- 2 coordinating patterned papers or cardstock.
- various coordinating **ribbons** (about 1 yard total).
- Diamond Dust or other **clear glitter** (optional).
- **clear liquid glue** (optional).
- 1/4" hole punch.
- **circle cutter** or 2" circle punch.
- **journaling pen**.
- **pop dots** or other pop-up adhesive such as pop up glue dots.
- craft knife, cutting mat and metal-edge ruler (optional).
- **sandpaper** (optional).
- computer and printer for template printing.
- downloadable template from classroom.
- 3-5 photos of what "peace" means to you (I used a photo of my hobbies and Coleman).
