February Supply list

As you know, a year is a long time to plan for and creativity can't always be thought out beforehand so I will create an updated supply list for each month as we go along that tells you everything I actually used for each project and layout of the month.

Many of these supplies will already be listed on your general supply list, but some of them won't. As you know, I support you doing your own thing as well! Don't be afraid to try new techniques and products, but also try to use up your own stash when you can. Part of the fun is seeing your own take on each project or layout.

Supplies Needed for February:

At Big Picture Scrapbooking, substitutions are encouraged! Our supply lists are designed to help you use what you have on hand. When you do need help or additional supplies, we believe the personal attention at your local scrapbook store can't be beat. We are pleased to be in partnership with Scrapbook.com to offer you a visual reference to tools and products you will need to gather. We cannot guarantee the availability of every item on this list, but we work diligently with the Scrapbook.com team and appreciate their efforts to provide a convenient, one-stop resource online.

If you live in the South Pacific, please shop with our partner Craft House for more convenient shopping in your part of the world!

She recommends that you email them specifically and tell them you are taking this workshop to see if they can help you get more supplies.

To prepare for February, please gather the following:

- Basic tool kit (to purchase items like these, [click here](#)).

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Week 1 Project:

- 6" x 6" size "Heart Sheer Binder" from Maya Road (project can be adapted to fit other heart-shaped albums).
- [Clear Scraps option](#)
- three to four sheets patterned paper or cardstock.
- 12" coordinating ribbon.
- strong, clear, dry adhesive (I used Tombow [Mono Adhesive](#) and it worked really well on the sheer binder).
- [journaling pen](#) or small alphabet stamps and ink pad.
- craft knife and cutting mat (optional).
- [pop dots adhesive](#).
- circle cutter or circle punch (for titles).
- hole punch.
- titles and embellishments (downloaded from classroom)
- fourteen 3" x 5" photos (you'll receive the photo assignment during the first week of February).



Week 3 "Life Tunes" Layout:

Note: Check the classroom for Pre-Workshop instructions for preparing the cover and title page of your 9" x 9" BoBunny Chipboard Bare Naked Binder. In January, we completed the first layout in the book. In February, we will create a new layout to add to your binder.

You can continue the color palette you have started with the Pre-Workshop assignment, or change the color palette each month - it's up to you.

- 9" x 9" BoBunny [Bare Naked Binder](#) [Chipboard pages](#): you should already have these. We will use the backside of the tabbed page you started in January as well as the next tabbed chipboard page that came with your binder.



- three to four coordinating pattern papers or cardstock.
- fifteen to twenty [small flowers](#) (about 1/2"-1" size).
- scallop scissors - various sizes (optional).
- journaling pen.
- pop dots adhesive (optional).
- [craft knife](#) and [cutting mat](#).
- ruler.
- [1/4" hole punch](#).
- [sandpaper](#).
- lyrics template downloaded from classroom
- 5" x 7" landscape photo of a person important to you.
