### SUPPLY LIST

To prepare for class, Lisa suggests that you find six containers to gather supplies. These can be baskets, pockets in an expandable file, or whatever works for you and your space. For example, Lisa has used small plastic baskets from Target.

Please label these containers, designating one for each week of class. After you register, you can download Lisa's tags in the classroom to label your containers.



Now, go through the supplies that you have on hand and toss anything that fits one of the six categories into the corresponding basket. Lisa will use an assortment of items and encourages you to use what you have on hand.

If you are hoping to recreate any of the layouts that Lisa shares in class, the weekly handouts will include magazine-style supply lists for each layout so that you can see exactly what she used.

Meanwhile, let's fill up those baskets. Below are the categories and some examples of the types of products that we will be playing with in class. You do not need to purchase all of these items: these are merely examples of the kinds of things that Lisa has tossed into her baskets.

### **All that Sparkles**
