Supply List

If you're opening this supply list it can only mean one of two things. One, you're considering taking *Twelve* with me in 2012, or two you've already signed up and are beginning the preparations I've outlined. Either way, I'm delighted!

Here's the deal: It would be nearly impossible for me to tell you everything that you will need to scrapbook 12 layouts a month for a whole year, but I have compiled a list of some general items and product categories. I've also noted those items that you will need to set yourself up for success initially.

For *Twelve, A Journey to Inspired Scrapbooking*, you'll need:

- basic scrapbooking tools and supplies - paper trimmer, scissors, craft knife, photo and paper adhesive, dimensional adhesive like Glossy Accents and/or Glue Dots, cardstock, patterned paper and photos!
- scrapbooking embellishments.

Note: *We'll be gathering twelve smallish embellishments in each of the twelve colors on the extended color wheel. Many scrapbookers will be able to "shop their stash" for these embellishments. The Scrap by Color feature in the Superstore at Scrapbook.com will be helpful in locating colorful embellishments if you need to purchase some.*

- one black 12" x 12" scrapbook album with ten page protectors to use in compiling the Twenty Twelve Photos I Love album.

Note: *I'm using the Patterned Cloth Album with Embroidered Frame. I also love the Black and White Damask album and the Black and White Polka Dots album.*

For the Pre-Class Assignments, you'll need:

- one open bin large enough to comfortably hold 4" x 6" photos behind twelve different topics (tabbed dividers).

Note: bin is 8 1/2" wide by 9 1/2" long and 5 1/2" deep. It is constructed of white metal mesh, but there are so many options here—canvas, plastic, wood, etc...

- one coordinated line of patterned paper or several sheets of individual patterns from your own stash. I have used the [Happy Days](#) line from Echo Park.
- [chipboard](#) or cardboard that you can fashion into dividers for your bin.
- twelve medium sized [bulldog clips](#) or other clips to attach to dividers as tabs.
- one standard muffin tin.

Note: This does not need to be a new muffin tin; it just needs to be available to store colorful embellishments for the next year!

- spray paint for painting your muffin tin. You may also need a spray primer for complete and even coverage.

Note: Painting a muffin tin is not required, but it will be surprisingly fun!

A Note About Stacy's Scrapbooking Philosophy:

I believe the best scrapbooking products are those that you have on hand. I do not believe that patterned paper and decorative accents expire—ever! You are always welcome to use what you have, repurpose what you don't like and substitute what I use for something that you like better!
