To prepare for Camp Scrap please gather the following:

- [paper trimmer](#)
- scissors
- [adhesive](#)
- black or brown [journaling pen](#)
- photos
- assorted papers ([cardstock](#), [patterned paper](#))
- [embellishments](#) (letter stickers, rub-ons, stickers)

This is a class designed with substitutions in mind. You are free to use whatever colors, styles, and types of supplies you have on hand. During class, May will use a wide variety of supplies and assist you in making the most of your own stash. She will feature a wide variety of brands and techniques. Some supplies she will feature include:

- [stamps](#) (journaling, alphabet, shapes, or designs) and [inkpads](#)

- ephemera/memorabilia
- sewing materials (thread, machine, embroidery floss)
- [chipboard letters or shapes](#)
- [Glimmer Mist](#), glitter and other sparkle filled mediums
- [acrylic paint](#)
- [punches](#) (such as circle, star, border punch)
- other embellishments such as charms, memorabilia, small beads, brads, sequins, photo corners, etc.
