### Introduction from Kolette:

Welcome to the *Giving Well 2011* Master Supply List! Because we will be offering you such a wide variety of projects throughout the course of this workshop, a master supply list can be overwhelming. However, many of the projects use some of the same types of supplies. So, I have created a generic list of items used often throughout the class and a specific list of items that are more focused on one project. You might want to wait to get those items in order for you to make sure that you want to create the projects that use them. But it's your choice - do whatever works best for you.



Designate a specific area where you are going to start gathering your supplies. Choose a basket that you love, a tote or other container that will make you happy to start filling. Go through the products that you have "stock piled," and start finding the things that you might like to use for this workshop. Put it in your *Giving Well* Stash. Once the workshop starts, you may want to adjust the items in your stash according to the gift ideas or you may not decide to create every gift I show you. That's ok! Just adapt, adjust and move forward, looking for the perfect gift for each person on your list and using *Giving Well* as a resource for all your gift-giving.

Don't worry, you will receive a specific supply list every other day in each project's instructions that breaks down this master supply list for you - project by project.

## Giving Well Stash

### Basic Supplies Needed:

- [basic tool kit](#).
- 8 1/2" x 11" [white cardstock](#) for printing.
- coordinating [patterned papers](#), single-sided and double-sided [patterned cardstocks](#).
- solid [cardstock](#) (most projects only use a few sheets except one which will use about 20-30 sheets).
- [ribbon](#) (various widths and patterns).
- [acrylic paint](#) - whatever colors match each project.
- spray paint - Rustoleum 2x Coverage brand - whatever colors match each project.
- hemp or string (I like using baker's twine. Try a sampler pack from [here](#) that gives you lots of colors to choose from).
- thin wire - I used 22 gauge but just about any gauge will work.
- silk flowers of your choice - used for many projects, various styles needed.
- other [flower embellishments](#) of your choice such as paper, chipboard, plastic, etc.
- monogram embellishments of your choice such as: chipboard, stickers, wood, felt, etc.
- [inkpads](#) (optional).
- [alphabet stamps](#) - 1" high if possible.
- [brads](#) - small or various sizes.

### Tools:

- favorite [dry adhesive](#) such as tape runner.
- [hot glue gun](#) and glue sticks.
- [Quik Epoxy Steel](#). (available at Hobby Lobby - this is a must for some of the projects and will become your new best friend).
- Mod Podge.
- [Glue Dots](#).
- [paper trimmer](#).
- [scissors](#).
- [paper piercer](#) or thumb tack.
- corner rounder (optional).
- [circle cutter](#) or [circle punches](#).
- [hole punches](#) (1/8" or 1/4" size).
- wire cutters.
- drill or large nail and hammer.
- staple gun.
- thin [journaling pen](#).
- [metal ruler](#).
- pencil.
- sewing machine (optional).
- foam paint brushes.
- foam stamps or other [stamps](#).
- sand paper or sanding block (optional).
- [Xacto knife](#) and [mat](#).
- computer and printer.

### Supplies Needed for Specific Projects:

- published book of your choice (I used [Gratitude by Dan Zandra](#)).
- frames (various sizes and styles): one 16" x 20" with glass and mat, and five 5" x 7" or 4" x 6" size (these will be painted so go for bargains that don't necessarily match).
- PVC pipe (1 1/2" diameter).

- large PVC pipe cutter (found at hardware stores) or hacksaw.
- canvases: 8" x 10", 5" x 5", 8" x 8".
- 2' x 2' piece of 1/4" thick plywood (can be cut at most hardware stores).
- 18" x 18" sheet metal (can be cut at most hardware stores - be careful because edges will be sharp).
- 2' x 2' piece of foamboard (found at office supply stores - can be pieced together).
- one yard of fabric.
- two to four knobs or drawer pulls - look for unique or interesting ones (I used ones from [anthropology.com](http://anthropology.com) and the hardware store).
- two small hinges (ask at a hardware store if you aren't sure where to find them).
- eight blunt-end screws and bolts to fit into hinges.
- four small flathead screws.
- two saw-tooth picture hangers (I used the ones that hammer directly into the project without needing nails).
- 14" x 24" paintable louvered vinyl exterior shutters or something similar (set of 2).
- clear glitter or Diamond Dust glitter (optional).
- twenty letter-sized envelopes.
- glass or ceramic dinner plate (can use any shape and size, as well as bowls).
- sundae glass candlestick (can use any shape and size you choose).
- paper doilies (optional).
- 5" Styrofoam ball.
- small safety pin.
- shadowbox frame - about 12" x 12" (available at craft stores or Target or [amazon.com](http://amazon.com)).
- decorative easel (optional).
- spray varnish for acrylic paints (optional).
- 8" x 8" album with sheet protectors.
- large glass candy jar with lid.
- painter's tape.
- various coins.

Phew! That's quite a list! But with over a dozen different projects included in this workshop, there's bound to be a lot of supplies. Enjoy the process of gathering and remember that you are welcome to adapt any project to meet your needs.
