Note from Jen: In *Saving Your Sanity: Summer Travel* I am separating our class supplies into two areas of emphasis:

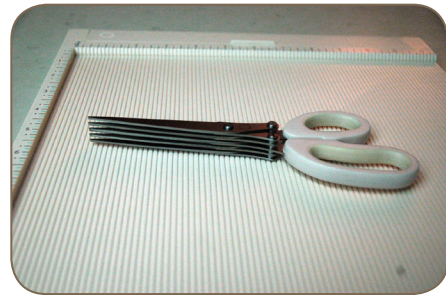
- Supplies and tools you may need to purchase - the supplies you will want to have on hand prior to beginning our class.
- Supplies you may easily find in your stash - will be items you most likely will find in your stash or that you may need to replenish.

Also, I have listed the tools that I use, but these are completely optional. Do NOT feel like you must have ALL of the optional supplies to complete this class, because you can create everything without them. I absolutely encourage you to use what you have in your own creative stash as additional embellishments to the projects, pages and albums in this class.

To prepare for Jen's class, please gather the following:

Supplies and tools you may need to purchase:

- [magazine file box](#) - I found mine at Ikea
- Pee Chee style folder
- [Lazy Susan](#) - I picked mine up at Ikea
- wallet sized accordion pocket organizer for receipts and coupons - check your local office supply store
- [five up pocket slip sleeve album](#) - Target has some great styles
- [scoring board](#) - I have the Martha Stewart Board - very useful tool, but completely optional
- Martha Stewart [fringe scissors](#) - completely optional
- [heat gun](#) - completely optional
- sewing machine - completely optional
- [hot glue gun](#) and [glue sticks](#) - I prefer the low temp style
- [Crop-a-Dile anywhere punch](#)
- stapler
- 1" book rings - check your local office supply store
- office tags - metal rim, jewelry tags, small tags of varying sizes and shapes
- [Mod-Podge](#)
- foam paint brushes and fine tip paint brush
- [acrylic paints](#)
- [Glimmer Mist](#) - completely optional
- [glossy accents](#) - optional
- [compass stamp set](#) and [mask](#) - completely optional



Supplies you may find in your stash:

- [chipboard](#) -five sheets or several cereal boxes - I love to recycle!
- [cardstock](#) - white, kraft and colors that will coordinate with your color scheme
- coordinating sheets of [patterned paper](#)
- fabric - canvas or muslin
- stamps
- [chipboard shapes](#)
- your favorite [embellishments](#) - some of my favorites: ribbon, stickers, tags, rub-ons, office supplies, buttons, brads and chipboard
